Dear Chairman Winship,

The Town Board of Franklinville at its duly called meeting of November 7, 1991 passed a resolution as follows;

The Citizens of the Town of Franklinville and surrounding towns having benefited from the natural pure waters in Western New York do not wish to have one of its natural resources contaminated; and

that it now appears that the siting of a landfill off Route 98 has the potential to threaten the purity of these waters; and

that this land in Farmersville appears to have been purchased under false pretenses by the Company called IWS; and the situation being further complicated by closed door meetings; and

that not only does this affect Farmersville water and landscape, it will affect the towns and villages of Franklinville, Ischua, Hinsdale and the City of Olean; and

that not only will there be a need for increased road maintenance, but air and noise pollution will be a problem because of the density of truck traffic; and

we believe that the siting of a landfill in Farmersville would affect our manner of living by lowering our property values;

Therefore, the Town Board of Franklinville opposes any legislation that would allow the current proposed landfill to be located in the Town of Farmersville.
