<p>Re: May 2012 Quarterly Meeting</p> <p>We recommend re-evaluating the length of quarterly meetings beginning with the May meeting.</p> <p>Unaddressed issues and questions have also accumulated since we began asking for more substantive meetings.</p> <p>At this time we are open to meeting during the day on May 23rd prior to the evening quarterly meeting to address more technical or complicated issues and clear them from the agenda, if this is feasible.</p>	<p>DOE and NYSERDA are considering lengthening the duration of the Quarterly Public Meetings (QPM).</p> <p>DOE and NYSERDA recognize that some correspondence has been inadvertently overlooked and not responded to. DOE and NYSERDA have implemented a correspondence tracking system to correct this.</p> <p>Representatives from the DOE, NYSERDA, and ECS met with Barbara Warren, Joanne Hameister, and Diane D’Arrigo from 2:00 to 3:30PM to discuss various topics prior to the May 23, 2012 Quarterly Public Meeting. Topics included:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Providing a 3 month WVDP project overview and timeline during the WVDP Project update. • Public input on Phase 1 Study topics. Written comments will be submitted to the appropriate SME working groups for their consideration. The public is also encouraged to ask questions of the SME and ISP at the QPM. • Environmental monitoring data collected as part of the WVDP environmental monitoring program and its reporting to the public. • Providing webcast capability during future QPMs. • Providing additional time for public questions of the SME and ISP during the QPM.
<p>I Comprehensive Overview of Work for the next year</p> <p>The Public desperately needs a <u>Comprehensive Overview</u> of the Work that will be done over the next year- a bird’s eye view if that describes it better. If the Agencies find it easier to discuss a different time period say 18 months or 2 years, that is OK also, but a year is the minimum time period we should hear about.</p> <p>We would like to know for example when the Interim End State will be finished and Phase I work actually will begin.</p>	<p>An overview of future near-term work to be performed at the WVDP is provided during the Project Update portion of the QPM. For work further out in time the public is encouraged to review the scope of work identified in the Phase 1 Decommissioning - Facility Disposition Contract awarded to CH2M Hill B&W West Valley (CHBWV).</p> <p>The Interim End State was completed with the completion of the West Valley Environmental Services (WVES) contract on August 28, 2011. Phase 1 decommissioning work officially began on</p>

Some key issues need more public discussion.</p>	<p>SEC began site characterization activities under the Characterization Sampling and Analysis Plan in June 2012. SEC performed gamma walkover surveys and collected surface and subsurface soil samples for analysis of radiological parameters in the:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Proposed location of the High-level Waste Canister Interim Storage Area. • The excavations associated with the Maintenance Triangle Area and the Product Storage Area. • Two background reference areas. <p>SEC completed this work in August 2012.</p> <p>The WVDP environmental monitoring program is a requirement of DOE Order 450.1A, “Environmental Protection Program,” which requires DOE sites to implement an environmental effluent and surveillance monitoring program to identify potential impacts to the environment from DOE operations. Environmental monitoring data collected as part of the WVDP environmental monitoring program is reported to the public annually in the WVDP Annual Site Environmental Report in accordance with requirements in DOE Order 231.1A, “Environment, Safety, and</p>
